Community Update - Jedburgh & District

School Link officer, PC Lawrence and Community Officer, PC Tait-Logan have been busy throughout July. This month saw the start of Jedburgh Campus' Summer club which has been relatively well attended by local young people. The sessions included baking and healthy eating inputs by Tesco community leader along with fun sports games. This club was free for all to attend on a Wednesday and Thursday throughout the holidays. Sessions included "Burgers and Badminton" and a special inflatable day which is ran by Live borders.

PC Tait-Logan, PC Lawrence and PS Granger have been working alongside Scottish Borders Council to address issues surrounding unauthorised encampments in the local area. We are here to support and advise all members of the community – both settled and travelling alike - and ask that any concerns are bought to our attention by using Contact Us form | Police Scotland, calling 101, e-mailing the community team on the address below, or by popping into the station.

PC Tait-Logan spent a large amount of time in July working on local events for Jedburgh Callants Festival, Kelso Civic Week, St Boswells Fair, Border Union Show and Eyemouth Herring Queen. In particular, she was heavily involved in Jedburgh events, attending and policing the vast majority of them, providing a high level of support to the organisers.



There was also a high level of police presence at St Boswells Fair, where again, officers were on hand to support both the settled and travelling communities. Unfortunately, there were reports of an incident on the evening of 19/07/25, and enquiries are ongoing. Any concerns regarding the fair should be reported on the same channels as above.

Protecting Vulnerable People in a Physical & Digital World

In July 2025 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 238 mental health related calls, around 24 missing person enquiries and approximately 120 domestic related incidents.

Jedburgh & District had 17 mental health related calls and 0 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.

Tackling Serious and Organised Crime

Serious and organised crime enforcement – July 2025

The Scottish Borders CID Proactive Unit executed 6 Drug & General Evidence Warrants during the month of July which resulted in the seizures of significant quantities of Class B, A controlled drugs with a street value of £15000, and cash in excess of £1000 from the various addresses.

3 persons were arrested, and 7 persons were reported for drug related offences during the month. These incidents were within Galashiels, Kelso, Eyemouth and Hawick.

Proactive CID would like to re-enforce the message to all wards that any drug related crime or organised criminality in the Scottish Borders can be anonymously reported via CrimeStoppers, who are an independent charity not connected to the Police. The public can of course still use 101 for this purpose too.
