Jedburgh and District Community Councils Multi Member Ward Report for November 2025

Community Update - Jedburgh & District



School Link officer, PC Lawrence has been working with the school campus Community Learning and Development worker, Mary McDaid. They have been putting plans together to run a 4-week block of inputs called 'Imagine A Man'. This programme is based around positive masculinity. Pupils will be asked how they feel 'a man' is portrayed in society and how they have come to that decision.

Alongside this, there is a mirror programme called 'Lassies are not feert', which is a programme designed to increase young people's understanding of what young woman in Scotland experience and their involvement in violence.

PC Lawrence has also been working with a young people who are between the age of 8-11. Some of these young people may be on the cusp of committing crime but are currently under the age of criminal responsibility. This is to try and help steer the young people onto the correct path and discourage them from committing crime in the future.

Community Beat Officer, PC Tait-Logan has been involved in carrying out various patrols for operation Jackdaw aimed at tackling and reducing shoplifting throughout the ward area. She has also been working hard on reducing parking issues in Jedburgh High Street. Warnings have been given where appropriate, but parking tickets have also been issued when these have not been adhered to.

PC Tait-Logan is in the process of producing a leaflet for all residents and retailers reminding them of the parking restrictions in and around Jedburgh area.

PC Tait-Logan also attended Jedburgh remembrance parade and was responsible for road closures. Other community officers were present at the Christmas light swich on which was well attended by the local community.

Protecting Vulnerable People in a Physical & Digital World

In November 2025 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 184 mental health related calls, around 20 missing person enquiries and approximately 97 domestic related incidents.

Jedburgh & District had 11 mental health related calls and no missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



Reducing Violence and Anti-Social Behaviour

Assault

• On 04/11/2025 report of assault at Heiton. Crime report submitted and enquiries ongoing.

Anti-Social Behaviour

- On 01/11/2025 report of a disturbance at Lilliardsedge Caravan Park. Officers attended and issued a male with a Recorded Police Warning.
- On 04/11/2025 report of a disturbance in Howdenburn Court, Jedburgh. No criminality, no further police action required.
- On 06/11/2025 report threats made by neighbour in Lothian Road, Jedburgh. Enquiries ongoing.

Vandalism

• On 05/11/2025 report of damage to public toilets in Abbey Place, Jedburgh whereby toilets have been blocked, bins thrown over and entrance glass smashed. Enquiries ongoing.

Theft

- On 03/11/2025 report of theft of items from within motor vehicle parked outside Greenmount, Ancrum. Enquiries ongoing.
- On 16/11/2025 report of theft of items from motor vehicle. Enquiries ongoing.



Improving Road Safety

- On 02/11/2025 a driver was issued a fine and penalty points for careless/inconsiderate driving in Jedburgh.
- On 09/11/2025 report of male drink driver in Lanton Road, Jedburgh. A crime report has been submitted. Enquiries ongoing.

Tackling Serious and Organised Crime

Serious and organised crime enforcement - November 2025

The Scottish Borders CID Proactive Unit executed 3 Drug & General Evidence Warrants during the month of October within the towns of Hawick, Jedburgh and Peebles aswell as positive stop and searches in Hawick and Melrose. These resulted in the seizures of quantities of Class A/B controlled drugs and 4 figures sums of cash aswell as a large cannabis cultivation. 5 persons were reported for drug related offences including proceeds of crime during the month.

Serious and organised crime impacts local communities across the Borders and anyone with information on criminal activity are asked to contact Police Scotland on 101, report it at any Police Station or report it anonymously via the Crime Stoppers Charity.

This information can be on any criminal matter but includes an individuals unexplained financial gain or wealth or persons who are vulnerable in our communities and being targeted or exploited by others for any reason.

With Christmas not far off, Police Scotland are focussing on online safety in the run up to the festive period:

Online Safety encourages people to think about what they are posting on social networking sites and to make sure their web browser and internet security is up to date.

Shop Safely by keeping presents out of sight in cars and being careful when using cash machines.
